Scientific surveys are used to estimate populations of plant and animal species. These codes are used to represent the status of populations.

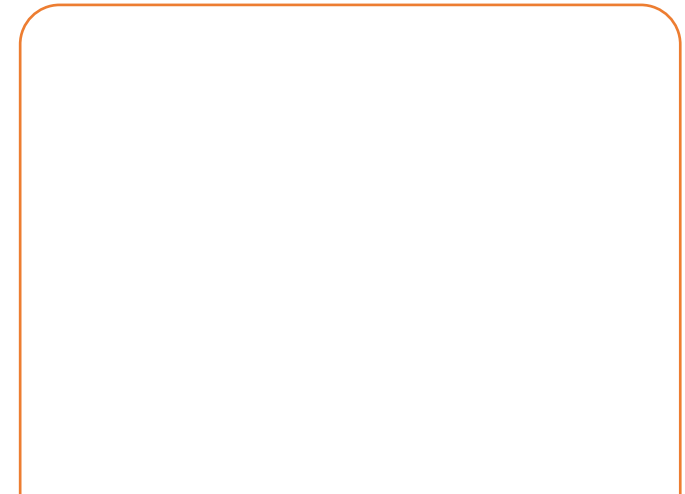

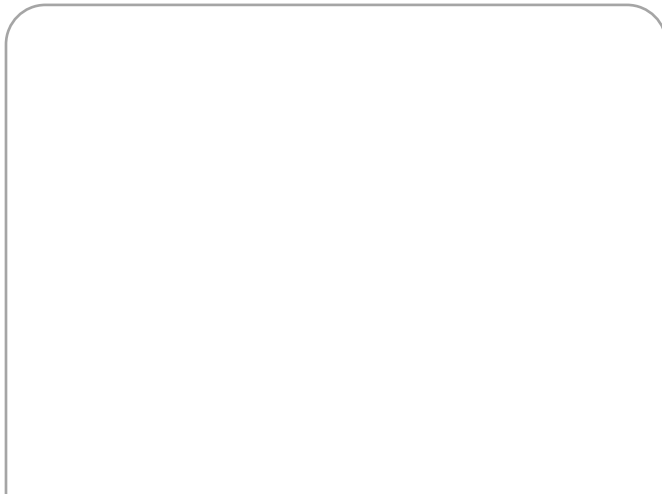
